

Open Access to Publication results

Roads to Open Access

- Gold Road → results published in an Open Access journal. The access to the document is immediate and free for all on the publisher's website.
- ☐ Green Road → authors publish in a journal (often available by subscription) and deposit a freely accessible copy of their article in an archive of their choice
- □ Hybrid Road → authors publish in a subscription journal and pay an additional fee to make the article available in Open Access.




Reminder!

- ☐ If your research is linked to a public research project remember that:
 - Before submitting any research publication to a journal or to a conference you should ask permission to the consortium members → very important in HE projects! (minimum 15 days in advance)
 - □ In the acknowledgements section, don't forget to add the acronym and reference of the project, as well as the funding body → see "Guia de gestió" of your project to know exactly the text that should appear


- What is required?
 - All peer-reviewed scientific publications arising from Horizon Europe funding have to be made available in open access, **immediately upon publication** and with no restrictions on use, by **depositing them on a trusted repository**.



- What should I deposit on the repository?
 - Postprint version (Author-accepted manuscript, AAM) or Published version (Version of Record, VoR), depending on the conditions imposed by the publisher



- What should I deposit on the repository?

Publications have to be licensed under CC BY. CC BY-NC/ND are allowed for long-text formats

Metadata of deposited publications must be licensed under **CCO**, in line with FAIR principles, including information about:

- Publication (authors, title, date of publication, publication venue)
- HE funding
- grant project name, acronym and number
- licensing terms
- Persistent identifier, PID (doi, handle, etc)

- Which repository should I use?
 - https://zenodo.org/ → widely used. Suitable for those organizations that do not have an institutional trusted repository
 - https://dugi-doc.udg.edu/ → UdG institutional repository. One of the most well-recognized repositories in Spain.





Personal websites and databases, publisher websites, as well as cloud storage services (Dropbox, Google drive, etc) are not considered repositories.

Academia.edu, ResearchGate and similar platforms do not allow open access under the terms required and are **NOT** considered repositories.

Open Access to research data

Research Data - FAIR principles

FINDABLE

Unique identifiers and metadata are used to allow data to be located quickly and efficiently



ACCESSIBLE

Data is open, free and universally available for research discovery efforts



INTER-OPERABLE

A common programming language is used to allow use in a broad range of applications



REUSABLE

All data is clearly described and outlines associated data-use standards





As open as possible, as closed as necessary

■ There can be exceptions to open access to research data



Research data must be licensed under CC0 or CC BY.

Metadata of research data must be licensed under **CC0**, in line with FAIR principles, including information about:

- Datasets (description, date of deposit, authors)
- HE funding
- grant project name, acronym and number
- licensing terms
- Persistent identifier, PID (doi, handle, etc)

Which repository should I use?


- CORA.RDR → https://dataverse.csuc.cat/dataverse/UdG
- ☐ Steps
 - Access with your UdG account
 - ☐ Deposit your datasets (including the README file)
 - □ Curation of the data → specialists from the library will manage, organize and maintain the data to meet the FAIR principles, create standardized metadata descriptions for datasets, quality control, etc.
- Benefits:
 - ☐ Files can be converted into open formats for long term preservation
 - ☐ Increased FAIRness of the datasets with the help of data curation staff
 - Huge capacity, up to 100GB for dataset (with the possibility of increasing it under request)
 - Long-term preservation (minimum 10 years)
 - ☐ You can update the datasets and make any versions as necessary



Data Management Plan (DMP)


What is a DMP?

- A document that outlines, from the start of the project, how research data will be handled during and after the project.
- ☐ It is mandatory to comply with the Research Data Management requirements in HE.



How to write a DMP

- □ EINA.DMP → https://dmp.csuc.cat/
- We can create a DMP based on the AEI or HE templates.
- It is a collaborative platform, we can edit the document with other consortium members
- It has guidelines and examples for all the sections

- In GREC, check your publications and deposit a copy of your papers. The aim is to gather all of our scientific production in the AMADE collection in **DUGiDocs!**
- Whenever possible, share your research data (experimental tests, scripts, methods, etc) with the scientific community.
